Organizing Committee for preparation of Russia's presidency in the Arctic Council approved

Members of the Organizing Committee include Advisor to the Russian President Anton Kobyakov; Minister for the Development of the Russian Far East and Arctic Alexei Chekunkov; Special Presidential Representative for International Cooperation in the Arctic and Antarctic Artur Chilingarov; Head of the Russian Federal Agency for Tourism Zarina Doguzova; Minister of Natural Resources Alexander Kozlov; Governor of St. Petersburg Alexander Beglov; CEO of the



United Shipbuilding Corporation Alexei Rakhmanov; CEO of the Roscongress Foundation Alexander Stuglev. The Committee has a total of 27 members.

Russian Government will review the new state programme for the Arctic development

The Ministry for the Development of the Russian Far East has submitted a draft action plan for the Russian Arctic Zone Development Strategy until 2035 to the Russian Government for reviewal. This was announced by Yury Trutnev, Deputy Prime Minister and Presidential Envoy to the Far Eastern Federal District, at a meeting of the Arctic Development Commission.

New preferential loan rules set for the Arctic residents

The Russian Prime Minister has approved the rules for preferential lending to the Arctic zone residents.

From now on, loans will be granted for projects in sectors determined by the Presidium of the State Commission for Arctic Development, except for logging, fishing, and mineral extraction. The cost of the investment project should be RUB 10 million–2.5 billion, and if it is implemented by several companies applying for a loan, the upper limit goes up to 5 RUB billion. The document also stipulates that the applicant must invest at least 30% of its own funds and ensure the creation of new jobs.

Mikhail Mishustin approved the subsidy rules for the creation and reconstruction of infrastructure in the Arctic. The companies operating in the Arctic zone will be partially reimbursed for their expenses in this area. Four Far Eastern Development Institutes will be merged

Changes will affect the following Far Eastern development institutes: Far East Human Capital Development Agency; Far East Investment and Export Agency; the Far East Development Corporation (FEDC), and the Far East and Arctic Development Fund. These organizations will be merged into a single institution for the development of the Russian Far East. Thus, Russian and foreign investors and partners implementing projects in the Far East and the Arctic will have a

A large gas chemical facility is planned in the Yamalo-Nenets Autonomous District

The creation of a gas chemical facility in the Yamalo-Nenets Autonomous District was discussed at a meeting chaired by Russian President Vladimir Putin.

As Deputy Prime Minister Alexander Novak noted, the large gas and chemical cluster in Yamal will help to attract more than RUB 2 trillion in investments and create 20 thousand new jobs. Non-commodity and non-energy exports will grow by RUB 125 billion a year.

The unique platform North Pole was launched in St. Petersburg

The North Pole platform is a mobile polar station. It can be in autonomous voyage for up to two years with the crew and scientific personnel onboard and host year-round polar expeditions. Developing cargo traffic along the Northern Sea Route was discussed at the Russia– Norway roundtable in the Ministry for the Development of the Far East and Arctic

In the first nine months of 2020, the volume of freight traffic on the NSR amounted to 24.5 million tonnes. And by 2024, according to Putin's decree, this figure should reach 80 million tonnes. The NSR is more environmentally efficient than other transportation routes, and Russia intends to ensure that its operation meets the most stringent environmental standards.

Representatives of the Murmansk Region government took part in the Russian-Finnish webinar "Joint actions for clean environment of the North".

At it, in particular, it was discussed that the largest high-latitude landfill in Drovyanoy is planned to be liquidated. Now, it was possible to install a stationary system of dust suppression with the use of fog guns. In the near future, a new programme for the general cleaning of the Arctic and a plan to implement a system for handling solid municipal waste in the North is planned to be developed.

Developing the Arctic transport infrastructure will ensure 2 thousand new jobs

About two thousand jobs will be created through the construction of the Northern Latitudinal Railway, which will connect the Northern Sea Route and the Trans-Siberian Railway.

The new project will not only provide people with jobs but will also improve the mobility of northerners due to the year-round operation of four passenger trains along the route Vologda–Salekhard–Nadym and further to the east. Additionally, in Komi plans to build Sosnogorsk–Indiga railway 612 kilometREs long, which will be a part of the 'Barentskomur' route. The project will provide access to the deep-water port of Indiga for exporting of oil and gas, mineral and timber resources
